
Food Insecurity





United Way's 211 has seen a 505% increase in food pantry requests which has resulted in a 506% increase in referrals to food providers across the state. There are currently 206 Food Pantries accepting referrals from 211 but many of these are concentrated in urban areas. Database curators are searching for additional resources to help meet the rising demand for food and reduce the transportation barriers families often face when trying to access food resources in rural communities

Utility Assistance Summary


United Way's 211 has made more than 3,000 referrals to a total of 112 providers that help with utility bills.

Many providers were forced to suspend or reduce electric bill payment services as part of the response to COVID-19, which creates a significant increase in unmet needs.

While Electric Service
Providers have suspended
shut-offs due to nonpayment,
many callers have expressed
concern over growing utility
bills they do not have the
means to pay.

211 is expecting a significant increase in both the request for bill payment and total amounts owed once shut-offs resume in South Carolina.

Housing Summary

Evictions: Many residents that have fallen behind on rent are being threatened with eviction. Some are reporting that they have been evicted when they left the home.

Shelters: Many Shelters are not able to accept new clients due to safety concerns for current residents.

Hotels: Many hotels that have been used for shelter are closed. Former residents are struggling to find a new place to stay with most shelters not being able to accept new clients.


Homeless: Families and individuals without homes have expressed concern that they will be arrested for breaking curfew. Many are not sure what to do or where to go to find shelter and comply with local officials.

Public Health: Many families and individuals without homes do not have the resources to self-isolate if they have become sick or believe they may have been exposed to COVID-19.






Urban and Rural Trends



Workforce Statistics

48% of callers are currently unemployed and account for **75%** of all employment related service requests.

59% of people seeking help with mortgage payments are unemployed. Only **16%** have a full-time job.

Only **16%** of people seeking help with utility bills make more than \$15,000 a year. Less than **25%** are in the workforce.

33% of retired callers are living with a food insecurity. **76%** of retired callers bring in less than \$15,000 a year.

3.5% of callers identify as veterans, but account for **15%** of all rent deposit and **30%** of landlord resolutions services.

27% of all callers are living with a disability and account for **24%** of all requests for shelter services.

Household Composition

70% of households with children are led by single moms. Only **25%** of single moms have some form of employment.

25% of callers identify as male, but account for **50%** of soup kitchen requests and detoxification services.

86% of grandparents that serve as legal guardians make less than \$15,000 a year. **30%** are living with a disability.

33% of people seeking shelter have a child in the family.




All maps shown on this page represent the Service Providers physically located in each county. There are many statewide and regional service providers that offer services to neighboring counties.


The United Way 211 Network maintains detailed information for 3,061 service providers that offer a total of 14,590 health and human service programs.




